
## A DIAGRAM IS A TRIVIAL MACHINE


Pattern of public use of Mexico City public space on October 28th, 2014













c) Tradition or circumstantiality?

The a-b-c-conditions of digging a pit




A possible social structure of belief - luck, destiny and fortune -
